## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Large Cap Growth Fund pursues long-term capital appreciation by investing in the stocks of quality, U.S. companies. The team favors companies that have offered above-average growth prospects, looking for companies with strong and/or improving earnings growth rates, as well as compelling growth stories.

## INVESTMENT PROCESS

The investment process begins with proprietary, quantitative research and modeling that help us define the market environment, analyze the investment universe and rank stocks from most to least attractive. The portfolio team incorporates a fundamental overlay to the process by reviewing buy/sell candidates and industry rankings to validate and interpret model rankings. Catholic screens are applied to ensure that all purchase candidates meet the USCCB investment guidelines.

## GROWTH OF \$10,000 (As of 3/31/26)

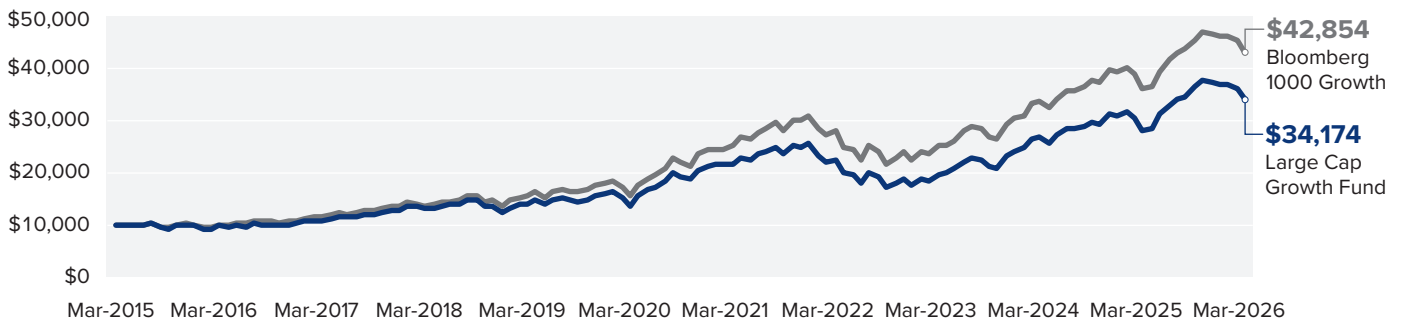


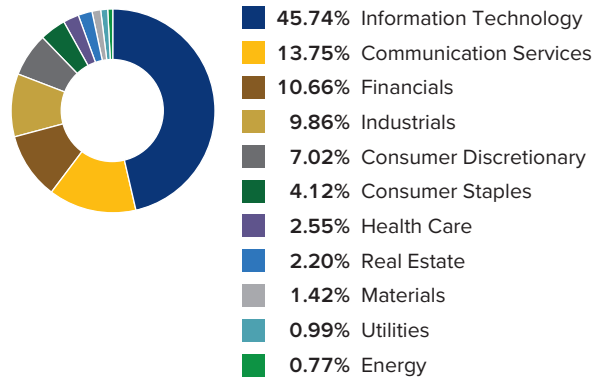

## QUARTERLY COMMENTARY

The market continued to rotate away from large capitalization growth stocks in the first quarter. The Bloomberg 1000 Growth Index was down -7.67% while the Bloomberg 1000 Growth Catholic Values Index was down -7.80%. The well-known Magnificent 7 was down -12.04% and underperformed as measured by the Bloomberg Magnificent 7 Index (BM7T Index). A culmination of factors were at play in the quarter including tech spending concerns on the AI infrastructure build out, geopolitical conflict in Iran leading to a spike in oil prices, renewed inflation concerns and a paring back of Fed rate cut expectations. Sector breadth in the quarter was balanced but with large return spreads between the best and worst groups. Six sectors outperformed the Bloomberg 1000 Growth Catholic Values Index, while five sectors underperformed. Energy (+34%) and Consumer Staples (+10%) led, while Healthcare (-13%) and Financials (-11%) lagged.

The Knights of Columbus Large Cap Growth Fund underperformed the Bloomberg 1000 Catholic Growth Catholic Values Index in the quarter, returning -7.88%. The underperformance was primarily driven by security selection, while allocation benefited in the quarter. The largest negative contributor to relative performance was Information Technology (-12%), driven by Tech Hardware & Equipment. Owning flash-based external storage company Everpure, Inc. (0.3% Average Weight, -20.9% Total Return) hurt as it traded down on earnings due to pull forward in first half demand making the second half of this year

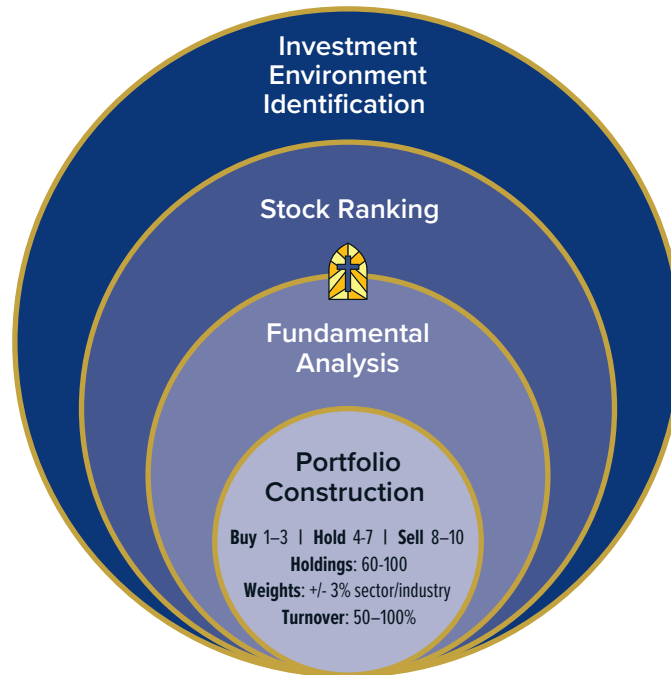

appear weaker, while not owning the top-performing optical electronics stocks in the group (Ciena Corp +66.0%, Lumentum Holdings Inc. +90.7%) hurt. The second largest negative contributor to relative performance was Healthcare (-18%). Medical device company Boston Scientific Corp (0.7%, -34.2%) sold off sharply after issuing a weaker than expected 2026 guide and providing an underwhelming medical device trial update.

The largest positive contributor to relative performance was Utilities (+22%). Integrated energy company Entergy Corp (0.8%, +22.4%) performed well driven by a major data center agreement with Meta announced in March. Financials (-10%) was the second largest positive contributor to relative performance driven by Diversified Financials. The Bank of New York Mellon Corp (0.8%, +2.7%) had a strong earnings report and raised their guidance significantly with positive organic growth commentary driving shares higher.

2026 is off to a volatile start and investor focus remains on geopolitical developments, the AI trade, rotation dynamics in the market and the Fed. Geopolitical conflict in the quarter has added additional concerns including spiking oil prices and a potential inflation resurgence. In addition, we continue to watch for overall earnings durability and the potential for earnings growth to broaden out. We recognize elevated risks and continue to maintain a balanced approach to portfolio construction while navigating this market environment.

Large-cap growth funds typically have above-average characteristics compared to the S&P 500 Index.

**Bloomberg US 1000 Growth Total Return Index** — Bloomberg US 1000 Growth Total Return Index provides exposure to companies with superior growth factor scores based on their earnings yield, valuation, dividend yield, and growth. The Index is constructed in a three-step process: (1) eligibility universe definition, (2) liquidity screening and (3) segmentation on the selection date. The Index is rebalanced following the selection date in March and September to ensure new and growing equities are included and that the represented companies continue to reflect growth characteristics. Additionally, Index constituents’ weights will be updated in June and December.
