Knights of Columbus Announces Novena for Peace and Healing in Ukraine

New Haven, Conn. — The Knights of Columbus announced today a novena — nine days of prayer — for peace and healing prior to the two-year anniversary of the violent conflict in Ukraine. The novena will begin on Thursday, February 15, and conclude on Friday, February 23. Each prayer in the novena is accompanied by a video featuring people impacted by the conflict, including a widow who lost her husband, an orphan whose parents were killed, a Catholic priest held in captivity, veterans, medical personnel and internally displaced people.

A young Ukrainian woman developed the reflections contained in this novena. Her unique perspectives illuminate the necessity for prayerful solidarity and the context of the Knights' humanitarian efforts that have helped more than 1.6 million people. Some 10,000 Knights in Poland and Ukraine have distributed over 7.7 million pounds of food and supplies through Knights of Columbus Charity Convoys, along with 250,000 care packages, 4,000 coats to Ukrainian children, 60,000 rosaries and hundreds of wheelchairs, generators and other essentials.

While praying the novena to mark the anniversary of the conflict is certainly appropriate in its timing, it was written so it could be prayed at any time of the year.
