### **Dear Guild Member,**

n the five years since the beatification of Father Michael J. McGivney, there have been significant changes in the life of the Church. On the diocesan level, we have seen the consolidation of all the churches in New Haven, Conn., into Blessed Michael McGivney



Parish, the first in the world to be named for the Founder. In the universal Church, we mourned the death of Pope Francis in April and celebrated the election of Pope Leo XIV in May as the Vicar of Christ on earth. As is often the case, a new Holy Father brings a wave of excitement among the people of God, and Pope Leo has invited every Catholic to "return to the heart," meaning to turn to our relationship with Jesus as the true path to happiness and peace.

The Holy Father's preaching and teaching have been focused on spiritual and supernatural realities, reflecting the writings of St. Augustine, the patron and inspiration for his religious order of priests. It is a timeless message that has sustained the Church for centuries. The ease with which Leo speaks to every segment of the Christian world reminds us of Blessed Michael McGivney's ability to speak with every sort of person he encountered, from Protestant elites of Yale University to gravediggers in the cemetery at Thomaston, Connecticut, where he was pastor. Respect for the person and belief in the sanctity of all human life gave Father McGivney the ability to speak comfortably from the heart to all those he met in his busy priestly ministry.

He understood that the family is the foundation of all human society, and only with strong parental figures, especially the father, could the family flourish and impart sound moral values to children. He was a tireless advocate who provided for the spiritual, economic, legal and emotional support of families. Falther McGivney was a true apostle and guardian of Christian family life. His decision to found the Knights of Columbus was a

### Infection Healed

I went to the ER, delirious with an infection that turned out to be deadly bacteria. After I was released, I got into my car and drove about 150 miles into North Carolina. I had no idea how I got there or where I was. I was on the side of the road when a man stopped and asked if I was OK. I said, "No, I think I'm dying." An off-duty paramedic, he called for an ambulance and the sheriff. I was taken to the nearest hospital, but they could not treat me, so they put me in an ambulance again and drove to another hospital. I knew it was bad, so I started praying to Father McGivney as well as to the Lord. I was in ICU for six days, until the bacteria subsided. I asked Father McGivney to please help me so I could see my daughters get married and have children. I could feel him at my side as I kept thinking about when I became a Fourth Degree Knight at St Patrick's Cathedral earlier this year and saw the beautiful statue unveiled of Father McGivney. I knew that he would hear me and know my work on earth was not finished. For the rest of my life, one of my goals is to save every unborn child I can and pray for those women and those babies. I owe my life to Father McGivney and will do everything in my power for the rest of my life to live by his teachings and sacrifices.

### **Stroke**

My brother suffered a stroke, losing his speech. I was at morning Mass the following day, prayed the rosary with the congregation, and then prayed the Divine Mercy Chaplet for the complete healing of my brother's brain, specifically of "every cell in his brain." I then went to the Blessed Michael McGivney Chapel in Bethany Beach, Delaware, to pray at Eucharistic Adoration. The next day, my brother was 100% completely healed! I was unfamiliar with Blessed Michael McGivney before this. In my heart, I hold an extremely clear certainty that his intervention allowed the spirit of healing for my brother. Father McGivney is in my thoughts and "feelings" nonstop. I believe this is a miracle due to his intervention.

On 6/24, I had a very specialized heart test during which I prayed to Father McGivney with much fervor and faith. The results showed an ejection fraction of 51%. Above 50% is considered normal. I attribute this to Father McGivney's intercession.



practical expression of his determination to "preach" the nobility and holiness of the Catholic family. This fraternal society aimed at the formation of Catholic men who would carry the principles of faith and charity into the family and from there into the wider world, where they could impact the lives of the most vulnerable and needy.

Today, some 135 years after Father McGivney's holy death, Pope Leo speaks of the family with similar verve and insight. For both Father McGivney and our Holy Father, the reality of family life must begin in our relationship with Jesus Christ. This turn toward the inner life of each person, each mother or father, each son or daughter, is the seed and springboard for creating strong families that become the foundation of a more just and loving society. In a recent homily, Pope Leo insisted that faith "is shared like food at the family table and like the love in our hearts. In this way, families become privileged places in which to encounter Jesus, who loves us and desires our good, always."

As natural families and as the fraternal family of the Knights of Columbus, let us prepare for the feast day of Blessed Michael McGivney (August 13) with a renewed intensity in our prayers that he will be raised soon to the honors of the altar as a canonized saint. The miracle required by the Church for canonization can only be supplied by the providential action of God, so we place all our trust in the love of God and the intercession of Blessed Michael before his heavenly throne.

Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us, as we pray for your canonization!
